Spirit Masks of the Old Coastal Bering Sea Yupik Culture "Two-Headed Walrus"

The Coastal Bering Sea Yupik people believed that every object, whether living or natural, had some form of a spirit called Inua. There were people chosen to communicate with the spirit world known as "Angalkut" (ahng-ah-lh-good) or medicine men/women. The Angalkut also designed the masks in their own representation of a spirit. The walrus is frequently used to represent strength.

The spirit, portrayed as a human face, is shown on the back or the front of the mask. The walrus. The spirit of strength is the center of the mask, and everything represents

the source of all strength. It is where the physical and moral strength comes from.

The sticks attached to the mask

(the four appendages) symbolize many different things.

The diagonal sticks attached to the mask, and base support for the appendages and the hoops, symbolize the four seasons: Fall (upper left); Winter (upper right); Spring (lower right); Summer(lower left). The vertical and horizontal sticks attached to both hoops represent the four directions: North (top); South (bottom); West (left); and East (right). The inner hoop represents the earth, and the outer, the skies and the sun.

Lastly, various appendages represent certain themes: Circles, some with dots, symbolize the male and female power of the male, a solid dot at the center; female, a small circle.
